Today, more than 28,000 students are enrolled from 115 countries. Students can enhance their university experience by spending a semester enjoying the fantastic cultural and social activities in Albany. A five hour drive from Perth and situated in the picturesque Great Southern region of Western Australia, our Albany campus offers unique learning and research opportunities. Why not consider one semester in Perth, and one semester in Albany? Keeping in mind the distance of 420kms between the two, it is not possible to take units from both campuses within the same semester, students need to live and study in either Perth (Crawley campus) or Albany.

## Nomination process

- A call for nominations, including a **unique link**, is sent to Exchange and Study Abroad partners twice/year:
  - **February** for Semester 2 (February - June) and Split Year (July - June)
  - **August** for Semester 1 (February - June) and Academic Year

## Application process

- Nominated students are contacted by the Global Learning Office with application instructions
- Students need to complete an online application and upload supporting documents:
  - Colour copy of passport page
  - Official academic transcript in English, or the original accompanied by an official translation
  - Evidence of English Language competency

## English Language competency (ELC)

- IELTS: 6.5 (no band below 6.0)
- TOEFL (iBT): 82 (minimum scores of 22 Writing, 18 Reading, 20 Speaking and 20 Listening)

**Alternative ELC tests are acceptable.** Students not meeting the standard ELC requirements may be approved admission on the basis of an Alternative ELC, assessed case-by-case. Approved students need to enrol in Professional and Academic Communication (**PACM1100**) and minimum requirements are:

- IELTS 6.0 (no band score below 5.5)
- TOEFL (iBT): 70 (minimum scores of 20 Writing, 14 Reading, 19 Speaking and 17 in Listening)
- UWA Centre for English Language Teaching (**CELT**) English Language Pathways: EAP Pathway 65% (no band below 60%) or Bridging Course Module 1 65% / Module 2 60% (no band below 60%)

## Academic load

- Semester minimum: **18 UWA credit points** (3 units), equivalent to 22.5 ECTS, 45 UK credits, 12 US credits
- Semester maximum: **24 UWA credit points** (4 units), equivalent to 30 ECTS, 60 UK credit, 15 US credits

## Course/Unit and Enrolment information

- 'Course' at UWA refers to a degree program, e.g. Bachelor of Science.
- 'Unit' at UWA refers to an individual class, e.g. ENVT2250 Ecology.
- Undergraduate units: Level **1, 2 or 3** (e.g. BIOL1130)
- Postgraduate units: Level **4 or 5** (e.g. MGMT5511)
- Class format: Lectures, tutorials, labs, practicums
- Language of instruction: English

Students will be asked and assessed for their unit selection prior to arrival. Enrolment can be finalised pre-departure and the last day for unit changes is Friday of Week 1 of classes.

## Academic restrictions

Units in the **Medical** and **Dentistry** Schools and **postgraduate** units in the School of **Psychological Sciences** are not available to Exchange and Study Abroad students. Postgraduate units (JD, Master) in the School of Law and undergraduate units in the School of Psychological Sciences are strictly limited to students meeting unit pre-requisites.

Students may apply to take any other unit in a standard course that they meet the prerequisites for. A few units may be (quota) restricted.

**Undergraduate** students: Completion of one semester of study; and be in Good Academic Standing

**Postgraduate** students: Completion of a bachelor's degree (or equivalent)

## Student Services and Amenities Fee (SSAF)

SSAF is applicable to Study Abroad students. Exchange students are exempted.

## Visa Information

Students need to ensure they arrive on a visa that allows them to lawfully **study** in Australia for the duration of their visa duration. More information can be found on the Department of Home Affairs website.

## Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)

OSHC is an Australian Student Visa requirement and information is available at the [Department of Home Affairs](#). UWA can arrange OSHC for students through [Medibank](#). Alternatively, students can purchase their own OSHC through one of the [Australian Government approved providers](#).

Residents from Sweden, Norway and Belgium are [exempt from requiring to purchase OSHC](#). New Zealand and Australian (dual) citizens, who are eligible for Medicare, do not require OSHC. Students are unable to apply for an insurance waiver if they have purchased their own health insurance coverage.

## Academic Transcripts

At the end of their studies, an academic transcripts will be sent to students directly via the [My eEquals secure transcript repository](#). Students need to share the document with their home university.
